NAPTON AND FENNY COMPTON WARD STRATFORD DISTRICT COUNCIL

New Planning Rules: You may have heard that central Government is proposing new planning rules. Worryingly, it seems that this District could see its house building targets more than doubled under the proposals. In the Government's proposed new planning laws, local discretion over house building rates and numbers will be removed. Central Government will share out an annual house building target between local Councils, who will then be responsible for finding enough land to meet the target according to a formula.

A national planning consultancy has applied the new formulas across all local authority areas in England. The results show that Stratford District's increase in housing numbers would be one of the largest increases in the West Midlands. The new targets would represent a 129% increase on the current Core Strategy figures to a new requirement of 1,675 homes a year. Additionally, because much of the north of the District is Green Belt, and therefore protected, it would presumably mean much greater increases in house building in the remaining areas, including ours.

Although these are central Government proposals, my colleagues and I will challenge these ideas locally where we can.

County Councillor: Following the unexpected death of County Councillor Bob Stevens the 'Notice of Vacancy' for the Feldon County Division has been published. Normally this would trigger a by-election. As a result of emergency regulations - the Local Government (Coronavirus) Postponement of Elections and Referendums Act - it is expected that a poll cannot take place until 6th May 2021 at the earliest. If anyone wishes to know more about this position, please contact me. The Feldon County Councillor post covers Fenny Compton, Priors Marston & Hardwick, Ladbroke, Wormleighton, Harbury, Bishops & Long Itchington, Farnborough, Deppers, Ufton & Chesterton. In these unusual times we will have to work through this extended vacancy period as best as we can.

For myself, I will be working at a reduced capacity for a while as I recover from my heart attack, with support from colleagues. Again, I express my thanks for that help and for the many messages I have received wishing me well.

Recycling Centres: At the beginning of the Covid-19 crisis Warwickshire's recycling centres were all closed, with most reopening a few weeks later. However, Stockton and Wellesbourne did not. I formally raised this matter at the Council meeting on 13th July. My concern was that Stockton, in particular, provides an important local facility serving our area. Thank you to those that signed our on-line petition organised by Cllr Louis Adam and myself to press for reopening. I am pleased to say that the County Council has now announced that reopening is planned for Saturday 26th September, with bookings scheduled to be released a week before. There is a booking system in place for residents to book a slot at all the sites at www.warwickshire.gov.uk/recyclingcentres

Initially, Stockton will open only at weekends and Wellesbourne will open on weekends & Mondays only. Usual opening hours for these days will apply.

LETTER FROM THE VICARAGE

The seasons are changing, the leaves are turning and beginning to fall! If I am honest, as much as I love the changing seasons and the colours of autumnal leaves, the leaf clutter and debris is the bane of my life. It is one of the disadvantages of having a garden with several trees.

Last year we gave in and bought a leaf blower. So this morning I ventured out and started the little beauty up — within seconds I had a large bundle of leaves gathered up, but the power of the engine was blowing leaves all over the place, some flying into the air, others scurrying along the floor, some joining together and rolling as one, some were just stuck going nowhere. But most were going in the same direction with one goal, one destination and there was me with the power in my hand directing operations!

In many ways this is a vision of the church and our own Christian journey. Sometimes it might appear that we seem to drift aimlessly along, possibly feeling without a specific purpose or direction or we may get stuck in a rut. Yet there are other times when we are moving quickly with real focus/purpose and along the way we get caught up with others who are like minded and travelling in the same direction. However, the important thing to remember is that someone is guiding and directing the blower!

You see, just as God is in control of the changing seasons, he also helps to direct the things that are happening in our lives. We need to learn to trust him in all things, both big and small, this is where faith comes in. It is knowing that God has his hands on us and he is guiding and supporting us along the way. At times we may feel distant from him, alternately we may feel so attuned that his presence is tangible. However, the leaves where all heading in the same direction. God's plan for us as individuals and for us as a church fellowship is to join together, follow his way, grow in his likeness. How? The thing that causes the leaves to move is the wind, in this case caused by the motor. The Hebrew word for the Holy Spirit is 'Ruach' which translated means 'wind' 'or 'the breath of God'. As Christians when we welcome God into our lives, he quite literally breathes life into us, he places his Holy Spirit in our hearts which enables us to experience the love of God and equips us to grow in our faith. It is also his indwelling Spirit living in us that points to the family likeness in other Christians and deepens our fellowship. I do not know about you, but there are times when I meet a complete stranger that I can sense the 'family likeness', in their words and actions you can tell they are Christians! This is how God is able to ensure that we are heading in the same direction, with one purpose, why – because we're united by our faith and directed by the Holy Spirit.

This Autumn as we watch the leaves falling, letus remember that in good and difficult times alike God's 'Ruach' will continue to lead us and guide us as we put our faith and trust in him.





Little Makes -Halloween Marshmallow Monsters!





- Marshmallows
- White chocolate chips or white chocolate
- Silver ball cake decorations or similar
- Writing icing
- Strawberry laces (optional)

Melt the white chocolate in a glass bowl in the microwave To make your ghosts. Thread a couple of white marshmallows onto a lollipop stick for each one. Now dip the ghosts into the melted chocolate and swirl them around to cover the top of the ghosts' "heads". Bring them out and lay them flat on a paper plate for the chocolate to harden, pushing a couple of silver balls on for eyes before it does.

Use a tube of writing icing to draw on a mouth and any other features you would like. Keep in the fridge until you need them.

To make the ghouls, use either white or coloured marshmallows. Thread one on per stick. Add some green food colouring to the chocolate and then swirl the marshmallows in it as before, this time covering as much of the surface as possible. Use silver balls for eyes, but this time add some other decoration too: we used strawberry candy strands for hair and would have added chocolate drops for ears if we hadn't eaten them all already! Leave to harden as before.





Flu Vaccinations: Due to Covid-19, the flu vaccination season will be more challenging than normal for all of us and we are working hard to ensure that we can provide flu vaccination for all of those patients who are eligible.

We would like all our patients to be aware of the following:

- * There are different vaccines for different age groups, and they will be arriving at different times over the coming months. Clinics will have to be carefully planned to ensure we do not over book.
- * Personal Protective Equipment will be worn by our team with increased precautions in between vaccinations which will increase the time it takes.

Due to the above please understand the first flu clinics will only be for those patients 65 years and older or those at risk as identified by the practice.

You can help us when you arrive for a flu vaccination by being aware of the following guidance:

- * You must not attend if you have any COVID symptoms.
- * Clinics will be held outside to avoid all patients entering the surgery if rain is anticipated bring an umbrella. Vaccinations will occur under cover.
- * You must wear a face covering.
- * Please respect social distancing and be patient if there is a queue.
- * Clinics will take place initially at Shenington Surgery OX15 6NF due to the increased ability to park and maintain social distancing.
- * If patients have mobility problems and are unable to walk please call the reception and we will advise.

The next clinic will be held on Friday 2nd October 1pm-3:30pm. This clinic, at

Shenington Surgery, is strictly for pre-bookable appointments only. The Surgery will be contacting patients to invite them to attend a clinic, mostly by text message or telephone call. No other services will be available at the same time and the dispensary will be closed to minimise patient numbers. We will be holding more clinics and we will let you know once these have been finalised.

This year we strongly advise that you should have a flu vaccination with the increased risks associated with Covid-19 infection in vulnerable groups; one of the biggest risk factors is age.

We apologise in advance for any difficulties you face during the clinics and ask that you be patient with our team. These are new times for us all and we will not know how efficient this new way of working can be run until we try.

We look forward to seeing you at one of the vaccination clinics.

FRIENDS OF FENNY COMPTON & SHENINGTON SURGERY


